## Mrs. Gook - Field Day

Minutes from last meeting - No minutes were taken.

## Shawn Kuennen - playground equipment

We do not need to have the cushy surface underneath. Risk management signed off on it. It has been approved by the district and will be ordered. It will take up half of the pavilion (the half closest to the school will have the musical instruments equipment). We may not be able to use it throughout the winter due to the amount of snow, but it can be used the rest of the time.

We have some staffing changes. Things are not all solidified. We have officially hired Leo Mosher for next year (he was a mid-year hire after Stephanie Bartholomew retired) and they plan to keep him at 4th grade. Barish Dawson will not be returning. It has to do with our state and licensing requirements and frustration of meeting the requirements with her South Africa and UK licenses. She has poured her heart and soul into the STEM position. We hired Sarah Finstad to teach in the English side of our French DLI program - likely in $1^{\text {st }}$ grade and Renee Linford will likely switch to regular $1^{\text {st }}$ grade. Virginia Skeffington will be moving to Florida. Our French program has been on her shoulders since the beginning so it will be a big loss. There will be 5 sections in $4^{\text {th }}$ and $5^{\text {th }}$ grades (the "bubble"). Lindsay Herman is not returning after her year of leave. We will have 23 students in $5^{\text {th }}$ grade across 5 classes.

Julie Decker - Running with Ed
Julie was able to get sandbags for Saturday. We've got the Ranch Theme - we have bandanas for the volunteers. Kodiak Cakes will make pancakes. We'll also have donut holes, coffee, etc...Lance will be the DJ again. We try to keep it fun but not too crazy from an expense standpoint. We do need volunteers. If you or anyone you know can help us out. The first runners depart at 8 am from the Fieldhouse so will be there shortly thereafter as it is only about 3 miles. Volunteers need to be at JRES at 6:30/7 to open at 8am. We were pretty down in our participation rate this year. We were at $20-31 \%$ at the last week so unless we had a sudden surge, we won't likely win the participation prize (money). We won first place for participation last year. If you don't sign up, show up and cheer/hold signs. Joy had students participate in creating decorations. We need help setting up on Friday as well. See the sign-up Genius.

## Back to School Night

Different this coming year because school begins on Tuesday, August $20^{\text {th }}$. So, we are going to do it on Thursday, August $22^{\text {nd }}$ from $5-7 \mathrm{pm}$. For the younger kids, it'll be an open house but for the rest of the kids, they will have already met their teachers so they can sign up for positions, talk to the teachers, join the PTO, etc.

We are going to change the order of lunch recess. We will have recess before lunch! Shawn has been opposed to it for 10 years. But there are many reasons for it. Kids are so excited to play that they don't eat. Lots of food is wasted and because of that, less nutrition is going into their bodies. Primarily, he has been opposed to it because they have snow most of the year and coming in will be a slippery mess. The building isn't set up well for bringing them in via the cafeteria. The school is going to practice starting Monday. The Experiment: students will go to recess, then gather and be brought into the back door of the cafeteria. Our cafeteria workers have their schedule. Kindergarten will remain the same but $1^{\text {st- }} 5^{\text {th }}$ will start recess 20 minutes earlier than their usual lunch schedule. The slotted time they will be in the cafeteria will be the same as always. If it works, JRES will buy more big carpet mats for the winter. If it is worth continuing, they will do it this way. His hope is that they are less rushed, have let out energy and are hungrier and consume food better. The transition from recess to class is difficult. So, this may help. To begin May $20^{\text {th }}$.

We need a liaison to the PTO if they don't want room parents, too bad, they need one! In November, we should have a meeting for Teacher Appreciation Week, pick a theme, buy the supplies early and tag/bag them (especially for specialists).

Kate Bock will be a co-lead for the book fair next year. She needs a co-chair. As far as the calendar goes, same week at parent/teacher conferences, starts Sept 30 th. They've talked about the level of effort and times/dates open. It didn't impact sales in the spring. We don't know if there is enough support for a reading challenge. Trailside has an 8 -person committee just for the reading challenge. Room parents could help. If they can $\log$ in their own numbers, it would be better. It could be one week instead of two. The sheets were nicer last year. The reading challenge in years past, is usually spring. Shawn pushed to move it to the fall as it gets the wheels rolling to help with the reading habit. All parents said it has an impact. There was $30 \%$ participation. It should be higher. Martha will be sending her son to a different school so Kate needs a co-book fair helper volunteer person. Double the amount of people showed up for the breakfast this year (probably due to the shorter hours). The biggest issue was that we ran out of food and the sales were great.

Bonita Hutchinson - thanked all for a great JRES experience. It has been a family to them, and they are sad to leave.
Shawn thanked all who helped over the past several years. We've had a school-wide impact.

## Jaime Wooley - Fun Fall Fest

The price is back down to $\$ 10$ per kid ( $\$ 15$ at the door).
